Year:

1. Solar year: We live and work calculated by the sun calendar, passed down from Babylon and the Roman Empire, as 12 months and 365 days in a year.
2. Leap year: Every 4th year on this solar calendar, it is necessary to add one additional day to the end of February to keep the calendar on track.

Agriculture

5. Aviv – The basic meaning of the word Aviv is the stage in the growth of grain when the seeds have reached full size and are filling with starch but have not dried yet. During the plague of hail (Exodus 9:31), the barley was said to be Aviv and the flax in bud. Aviv accordingly also means spring, one of the four seasons.
6. This ripening of the Aviv barley is considered the first fruits of the year and without the first fruit of the land there cannot be a first fruit festival to the Lord.
7. Adding a thirteenth month is predicated on the ripening of the barley harvest.
